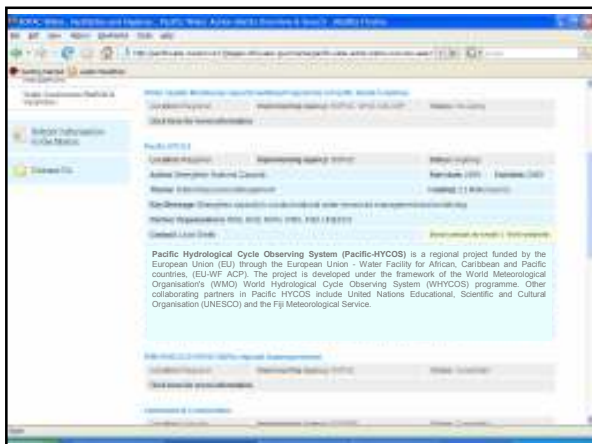

Coordinating Capacity Development

- Wastewater Management and Eco-sanitation Training

 - Communications strategy for water management and water safety planning

Technology Transfer by Buddy System

- Island to Island capacity building, similar issues, human resource constraints, cultural sensitivity
- Started through ASPA with ADB in Ebeye, RMI
- Replicated through WDM in pilot countries, e.g. Cook Islands to Solomon Islands to work together with Solomon Islands Water Authority for practical experience exchange
- Water Safety Planning e.g. buddy system by Cook Islands - Niue, Vanuatu - Solomon Islands and Tonga – Samoa and Palau – Marshall Islands
- Partnering to exchange ideas with various experts

Donor Harmonisation

- Required to address issues of duplication and lack of efficiency
- Pacific Action Matrix – who's doing what?
- Co-financing framework for IWRM provides an overview of bilateral projects
- Support of donor coordination on regional and national level
 - E.g. Cook Islands ADB PPTA

Donor Harmonisation

- Conduit for funding for local initiatives
 - E.g. WSSCC Tonga and Tuvalu
 - E.g. Japan Water Forum (Corporate Responsibility Programme, Kiribati)
 - E.g. Joint programming (WHO)
- Promote the use of National Water partnerships
- Support National Water and Sanitation Coordination Committees
- Promote the inclusion of WATSAN into National Sustainable Development Plans (NSDP's)
